

Regulations for grants at the NIA

The Netherlands Institute at Athens awards a number of grants for study stays in Athens. Students, graduates, PhD students and recent PhDs connected to the VU University, the Universities of Amsterdam, Leiden, Utrecht, Groningen and the Radboud University Nijmegen are eligible for these grants. Those who already receive payment or a grant for their research, or those who have previously been awarded the same type of grant from the NIA within the past five years, are in principle ineligible for these grants. The Goekoop-development grant may be applied for at every new stage of one's studies.

The research in question should be connected to Greece, and the stay in Athens should clearly add value to the research. In reviewing the applications, the quality of the proposal (research questions and work plan) and study results will be evaluated.

The following four grants are available:

1. Stipend for PhD students and recent PhDs.

There are a maximum of two stipends available annually. The research should result in a scholarly publication and/or part of a dissertation or book. The stipend provides free accommodation at the NIA for a period of up to three months, a monthly allowance of 700 Euro, and travel expenses to a maximum of 200 Euro.

2. Study grant for MA students or the recently graduated.

There are several study grants available annually for MA students and recent graduates. Individuals who finished their studies less recently and want to give impetus to their scholarly activity are also eligible for this grant. The study grant provides free accommodation at the NIA for a period up to three months, a monthly allowance of 400 Euro, and travel expenses to a maximum of 200 Euro.

3. Goekoop-development grant for all stages.

Each semester, the NIA has five Goekoop-development grants available, partly funded by the Friends of the NIA (VVNIA). The grant is intended for a three-week stay in Athens to develop a research proposal at any level. The study grant provides free accommodation at the NIA, a weekly allowance of 100 Euro, and travel expenses to a maximum of 200 Euro.

4. Accommodation allowance.

This allowance provides a reduction of 4 Euro per day in the room rate (to a maximum of 200 Euro).

Obligations of the grant holder.

A stipend or study grant holder will present their project at the end of their stay at the NIA. They will also submit a report of their research to the NIA and VVNIA. In the Netherlands, they will be prepared to present their research at the participating universities, for which the NIA offers travel expenses, and at gatherings of the NIA and VVNIA. The holder grants permission to the NIA to mention their activities on social media and is willing to actively contribute to such publicity. They will mention the NIA in all

publications and presentations based on or making use of the results of research supported by the grant. Partaking in the activities of the NIA and membership of the VVNIA will be very much appreciated.

Application procedure.

All grants can be applied for at any time of the year, development grant and accommodation allowance at least one month before the proposed start of the grant, stipend and study grant two months in advance. Development grant and accommodation allowance applications will be assessed by the director of the NIA. Stipend and study grant applications will be assessed by the NIA's Scientific Advisory Board. Applicants of stipend and study grant will be notified of the outcome of their application within one week of the Board's decision.
